(December 2013) The Committee ruled

that no honors student or honors professor should expect a studen<sup>o</sup> code of honor to be amended. Signed agreements, like signed checks, illustrate a willingness to keep promises. When professors allow students to break signed agreements, or when students connive to do so, students lose a most important attribute, as important as grades character.

It was resolved in December 2011 to have an Honors Orientation before classes started.

In 2012, the Committee allowed for Honors Probation in the case of students who had dropped beneath program requirements in terms of required Grade Point averages. The probation, at the discretion of the Honors Director, would allow the student one semester to re-qualify for GPA and Honors Code requirements.
