timely and efficient access to such services (e.g., academic advising and counseling), to learning materials (e.g., library resources), and to other benefits for which the student may be eligible.

E. NTCC student services staff will offer orientation sessions for dual credit students and their parents to assist them in becoming acquainted with the academic policies and support services of the college as described in Goal 1 of the State of Texas Goals for Dual Credit. High schools should request that parents of dual credit students sign a waiver that they understand the academic policies and procedures of the college, including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. \(\begin{align*}{0.0000} \text{B1232g}; \) 34 CFR Part 99), which is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. High school students can sign a waiver for FERPA, allowing the college to share information about the grades, attendance, and class status with the high school counselor.

- B. As the HB8 statute requires that eligible students in the FAST program incur no direct cost for dual credit coursework, school districts will be responsible for covering differential course fees and course material for FAST scholarship recipients participating in select workforce programs, as

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
